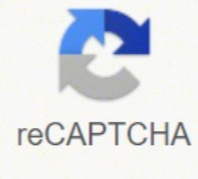

- **Comparative and superlative adjectives** are used to compare two or more things. The comparative form is used to compare two things and the superlative form is used to compare three or more things. For example, 'The cat is **blacker** than the dog.' and 'The cat is **the blackest** of all the cats in the house.'

Example: The cat is **blacker** than the dog.

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Comparative and superlative adjectives

Adjectives are used to describe the quality of a person, place, thing, or animal. They are used to give more information about a noun. For example, 'The cat is **black**.' and 'The dog is **big**.' Adjectives can be used to compare two or more things. For example, 'The cat is **blacker** than the dog.' and 'The cat is **the blackest** of all the cats in the house.'

Comparative and superlative adjectives

- **Positive degree** This is the original form of an adjective. For example, 'The cat is **black**.' and 'The dog is **big**.'

Example: The cat is **black**.

- **Comparative degree** This is used to compare two things. For example, 'The cat is **blacker** than the dog.' and 'The dog is **bigger** than the cat.'

Example: The cat is **blacker** than the dog.

- **Superlative degree** This is used to describe one thing as being the best or the worst of a group. For example, 'The cat is **the blackest** of all the cats in the house.' and 'The dog is **the biggest** of all the dogs in the park.'

Example: The cat is **the blackest** of all the cats in the house.

- **The comparative and superlative forms of adjectives**

Example: The cat is **blacker** than the dog.
